

Since 2005, Operation Access has provided care coordination, patient navigation, and volunteer engagement to coordinate over 150 surgical procedures and diagnostic services to low-income, uninsured Solano County residents.

Services are provided by physicians, nurses, and other professional staff who generously donate their time and skills in partnership with these hospitals and ambulatory care centers in partner facilities throughout the Bay Area.

Outpatient Services Provided

Breast, Dermatology, Gastroenterology, General Surgery, Gynecology, Plastic and Reconstructive, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Otolaryngology, Urology, Vascular Other outpatient services may be available.

Participating Hospitals and Ambulatory Care Centers

In 2016, community clinics identified a need for over 200 specialty services per year that is not being addressed by other programs.

OA is working to build its partner network and secure funding for care coordination and interpretation to launch a formal, full scale Solano County program in 2016 that addresses this need for services.
